## **JOINUS!** SAVE Berowra Police Station RALLY

State Member for Hornsby, Judy Hopwood, is calling on the Labor Government to stop the auction of Berowra Police Station, calling the sale 'the final nail in the coffin' of community-based policing in the area.

"Just weeks ago dozens of Brooklyn residents woke to find their tyres brazenly slashed by hoodlums, obviously emboldened by the knowledge there is no longer a police station close by," Mrs Hopwood said. This follows reports to Mrs Hopwood's office of increased vandalism and anti-social behaviour in Berowra since the State Government sold off Brooklyn Police Station.

"Brooklyn residents don't even have an Eagle Phone to use to contact Hornsby police directly in case of an emergency," said Mrs Hopwood.

"If the sale of Berowra Police

Station goes ahead, Brooklyn residents will feel even more vulnerable knowing the nearest police station is at least a halfhour's drive away."

Feedback from the community has indicated that an increase in visible policing was what people wanted, particularly for more isolated areas such as Berowra Waters and Dangar Island.

"Locals have been asking for a police officer at Berowra to be on-duty 24 hours a day for years; but despite a significant population increase in the area the station has often been closed," Mrs Hopwood said.

"Now it looks like the State Government's botched management of NSW will result in Berowra Police station being closed for good," said Mrs Hopwood. "I call on the Government to halt this sale to prove they are serious about community policing in Hornsby."

## **RSPCA CALLS FOR HELP TO END PUPPY FARM HORROR**

Not an isolated incident FROM THIS

The puppy farm uncovered on last week's RSPCA Animal Rescue aired on Channel 7 is not an isolated incident. [View episode here: http://au.tv.yahoo.com/plus7/rspca-animal-rescue] RSPCA Inspectors across Australia have seized thousands of dogs and other animals from such establishments over the past two years, many in appalling condition and some requiring euthanasia.

RSPCA Australia CEO Heather Neil said that when it comes to dog breeding, puppy farms are at the absolute bottom of the barrel.

"Dogs on puppy farms are little more than breeding machines used to make their owner's money. Most Australians would be appalled if they knew where many puppies actually came from," Ms Neil said.

"Mothers may be continually mated and kept with their puppies in cages and never allowed out to exercise, play, have companionship or even go to the toilet."

Chief Inspector of RSPCA NSW, David O'Shannessy, described one puppy farm case near Wollongong last year where Inspectors found a small dog in a cardboard box with a number of newborn puppies dead beside her.

"The mother still had one puppy lodged inside the birth canal and had been in labour for over six hours. 190 dogs and pups were seized from that puppy farm with many of the females going on to give birth while in the care of the RSPCA." TO THIS

Puppy farmers will sell to anyone, wholesale and retail, and by any means, on-line, through pet shops, via newspapers and car boot sales or by using a false house as a 'shop front'.

The RSPCA has released a puppy farm discussion paper and is calling on governments, responsible dog breeders and other groups to help end puppy farming in Australia.


"We face significant complications and legal hurdles in attempting to prosecute puppy farmers and preventing such farms from continuing to operate. Despite serious animal

welfare problems, many puppy farms can be licensed and regulated by local government and operate under local council permits," said Ms Neil.

"The RSPCA advocates the strict regulation of the breeding, supply and sale of companion animals to help set minimum standards and stamp out the mass-production of puppies for profit."

The RSPCA is calling for feedback on the discussion paper by the end of March 2010 with the view to holding a national roundtable on the issue mid year.

Photos: 104 dogs that were living in inappropriate conditions were seized by RSPCA Qld Inspectors from a Waterford address in January 2008. Many of the female dogs were already pregnant. Consequently that number eventually escalated to 147. The poodles have cost RSPCA Old well over \$1 million in veterinary treatment, medication and lodging. The owner of the dogs is still facing 149 charges under the Animal Care and Protection Act (2001) in Beenleigh Magistrates Court. ## Mayor's Column

Ratepayers will be aware that Council is planning to apply to the Minister for Local

Government



seeking approval to increase rates from July 2010 to improve the Shire's infrastructure. Council provided information about this proposed increase with rates notices late in 2009 and early this year. Information has also been available on our website. If approved, the increase would be used to fund the replacement of Hornsby Aquatic Centre and Hornsby pedestrian overbridge, which links Hornsby Station to Hornsby Mall. Recreational facilities would also be developed in Old Mans Valley, Hornsby. We need to update the Shire's infrastructure over the coming years if we are to meet the needs of our growing population. Council would also allocate \$1.5 million per ward for infrastructure projects such as improvements to sportsfields, playgrounds, footpaths and community centres.

The average household would pay about \$70 per year (about \$1.40 per week) more from 2010/11 if the increase is approved by the Minister. Rates would also increase with normal 'rate pegging' each year. Eligible pensions would be entitled to a discount of \$10. The new rate would be known as an infrastructure levy. It was with great excitement Alex Graham (pictured right, aged nine), his mother Penny, carer Jessica, Ray Phillipson (Hornsby Lions ), Bill Bradley (Hornsby Lions) and Noel Burchmore (Children's Mobility Foundation and Lugarno Lions), attended the Spastic Centre Hart Walker clinic on Tuesday 9th February at Allambie Heights. Alex was being fitted with a new 'heavy duty ' Hart Walker after nearly five years in his original one. Alex's old walker had survived three years on the soccer fields thanks to the Hornsby RSL Youth Football Club. The walker of course had been originally designed for gentle stepping inside the house or on footpaths. However soccer has been a huge part of Alex's life!

Young Alex Graham has athetoid cerebral palsy and uses a wheelchair to move around. The Hart Walker has allowed him the joy of walking hands free, being at eye level with his peers, and making choices about where he wants to go.

It also allows him to safely weight bear, and get fit.

Alex's new heavy duty Hart Walker was fully funded through the efforts of Hornsby Lions Club, Ku ring gai Lions, Hawkesbury South, Lugarno and seven other Sydney Lions Clubs.

Alex's Mum Penny said, "We are extremely grateful to the Children's Mobility Foundation and the Lions Clubs of Sydney who have so generously donated the twelve thousand dollars for Alex's new walker.

make a huge difference to the lives of children with physical disabilities."

## Population Boom to Push Housing Demand to the Limit

The Housing Industry Association welcomes the release of the Federal Government's third Intergenerational Report (IGR).

The IGR addresses the big picture issues affecting Australia's social and economic prosperity over the next 40 years focusing heavily on the impact that an ageing population has on key expenditure areas such as health, aged care and superannuation. Properly targeted immigration will be a vital tool in addressing the inevitable skills shortages Australia will face as workforce participation drops off. The IGR projects that Australia's population will increase from today's 22 million to 35.9 million by 2050. This larger population will be considerably older and is expected to lower economic growth and add considerable pressure to the Government budget as the working age population proportion shrinks and the retired age proportion increases.

HIA Managing Director, Mr Shane Goodwin said that an increase in the Australian population by 2050 to 35.9 million people would necessitate building 7.1 million new dwellings. "Such construction would represent a large increase over the building levels of the past 40 years and require annual building of over 30,000 dwellings per year in excess of 2009 levels," he said. "Current building levels fall well below that required by such strong population growth. Failure to address Australia's severe lack of housing will inevitably lead to further long term erosion in housing affordability and inadequate shelter provided to those most at risk," said Shane Goodwin.

"Commonwealth leadership is required to break through many of the supply impediments. To that end, HIA supports the Federal Government's pledge to link federal infrastructure funding to state and local governments for nationally consistent and appropriate land release and building approvals processes."

Land supply issues, high levels of taxation on new housing at all levels of government, and a slow and highly constrained building approvals process continue to stymie the building industry. Overcoming these structural barriers will require a concerted effort at all levels of government to ensure that shelter is both adequate and affordable for years to come.

### Making the most of interest rates

#### Dear Bush Tele,

I would like to inform you of what I see everyday at the school crossing.

The school crossing in question is on Hillcrest Road Berowra. About 90% of the parents and students do use the crossing correctly which is a credit to those people who are truly responsible for their life and their loved ones.

But it is sad and very disappointing to see that other irresponsible adults take risks and show their young children what all responsible parents and adults should not do when crossing a busy road. Last week the school would have lost a young student if it were not for the driver who obeyed the speed limit for school zones. In fact the vehicle would have been going at 30kmph. An adult and two children called the child over from the opposite side of the road to him, child and a 4WD meet, almost a fatal ending. Then the adult put the child in the car, left the door wide open, J walked across the road, a few minutes later got another child, J walked across the road once again as if nothing had happened. This all happened within 10m or less from the school crossing. How many more near misses will it take for the other irresponsible adults and parents to see that a school crossing is never too far away to be used and to teach our children the correct and safe ways to cross any road. Prevent a death of a child by showing them the right way. Children copy what you do. Each year there is a death of a young student because someone was too lazy or too time poor to care.

The school principal and staff have and continue to inform the parents and children to cross at the school crossing with care. Motorists, please read up the rules of the road as many of us would <u>not pass</u> a practical test regarding school crossings.





## **Upper North Shore Generosity** Is A Sight For Poor Eyes More than 1000 pairs of glasses have been donated to Simplicity Funerals

Hornsby and Allen Matthews Funerals Warrawee so far as part of the Lions Club Australia's 'Recycle for Sight' programme, which collects used glasses for disadvantaged adults and children in developing countries. The two funeral homes, along with a number of others throughout NSW, have been collecting glasses over 2009, and together have managed to gather more than 16,000 pairs so far.

Since the Save-Sight Foundation was established in 1964, significant quantities of donated glasses have been distributed via humanitarian organisations to countries in need, but there are many more people for whom the cost of purchasing glasses or even being seen by an eye specialist is out of the question. "These glasses are getting sent to extremely poor communities that have no regular access to health facilities and they rely on the generosity of other nations. ### PRICELESS PEARLS 14/11

By Ralph Estherby The first thing I noticed was that there were not

as many leaves to rake up as usual, and then I became more aware when small branches began to fall. It became even more apparent when large sheets of bark began to peel off of the tree like the unwrapping of a multi-layered onion, and I had absolutely no doubt left when I closely inspected the now dead and infested tree.

The problem was that I had a 'worm' - obviously many more than one - it is probably incorrect to call them 'worms' as they are actually large white 'borers' which attack an unhealthy tree and eat it from the outside in until there is nothing to be done and the tree can not survive. These small bugs start as a larvae and eat their way to adulthood and the tree suffers the consequence as they do. They are little invaders who are very difficult to deal with and, even if you are successful in removing them, leave permanent scars. My tree is now a very sad picture indeed - it does not a have a leaf on it, it is surrounded by discarded branches, it is totally dead and it needs to be cut down before it falls. The Bible tells us that our lives can experience a similar problem to my tree. "What the chewing locust left, the swarming locust has eaten; What the swarming locust left, the crawling locust has eaten; And what the crawling locust left, the consuming locust has eaten." Joel 1:4 These worms or 'locusts' can be many things: bitterness; unforgiveness; fear; doubt; sin; shame or disappointment. They can strip us of our hope, our faith and leave us as an empty and unfruitful shell which is destined to fade away or fall.

The truth is that these 'worms' are difficult to remove and they will leave scars but we are also given great hope that the outlook is not completely bleak.

"I will restore to you the years that the locusts have eaten...You shall be satisfied, your God, has dealt wondrously with you!" Joel 2:25-26 So if your 'tree' needs help I know someone who can help!

## **High blood** pressure: the silent killer

High blood pressure is often referred to as a 'silent killer' because most people don't feel any symptoms until it has caused considerable damage to their body. High blood pressure affects more than 2 million Australians and contributes to thousands of deaths every year. In the latest edition of MedicinesTalk,

the National Prescribing Service (NPS) recommends people have their blood pressure checked regularly even if they feel healthy, aren't overweight and don't have a family history of high blood pressure.

"High blood pressure, also known as hypertension, increases your chances of developing serious health problems like stroke, heart attack, dementia and kidney disease," NPS CEO Dr Lynn Weekes said.

"Given its silent nature, most people with high blood pressure don't feel sick, so they don't realise they have a problem."

How often your blood pressure should be checked depends on your age and health. Blood pressure is considered high if it's greater than 140/90 mmHg (or 140 over 90). Your doctor may recommend starting medicines to help reduce blood pressure, depending on your overall risk of cardiovascular disease

For some people, lifestyle changes such as losing weight, reducing the amount of salt in their food, exercising regularly and quitting smoking are enough to reduce their blood pressure to normal levels.

Others will need to take blood pressure medicines long term. "Even if you have no cause for concern, having your blood pressure checked is painless, quick and easy, and it might just save your life," Dr Weekes said.



## MORE CONCERNS ABOUT INSULATION RORTS

FEDERAL MEMBER FOR BEROWRA, PHILIP RUDDOCK IS AWAITING A RESPONSE FROM MINISTER FOR THE ENVIRONMENT, PETER GARRETT MP OVER WHAT APPEARS TO BE 'YET ANOTHER EXAMPLE OF POSSIBLE INSULATION REBATE RORTS.'



'A very concerned Glenorie resident came to my office recently to show me a letter he had received from the Government under the banner headline 'NATION BUILDING, Economic Stimulus Plan' advising him that a payment had been made to an installer for ceiling insulation in a rental property he owns,' said Mr Ruddock.

"The problem is, the owner knew nothing about the work and had given no permission for ceiling insulation to be installed." Mr Ruddock says he has contacted the Minister asking for details of the installer to be provided, together with details of the actual work supposedly done.

'The property owner wants to know who did the work, what licence and insurance credentials he has and what exactly was installed,' said Mr Ruddock.

The property owner is concerned that unauthorised work may or may not have been undertaken and, 'with all the reports we are hearing about dodgy installation work potentially causing fires and now possibly electrocution risks,' he is concerned for his tenants, his property and his insurance cover.

'This is yet another example of the inept manner in which this scheme has been administered,' said Mr Ruddock. 'Taxpayers are footing the bill for this debacle and the Rudd Government needs to be held accountable.'

If there are others in the electorate who have encountered problems with the ceiling insulation rebate scheme, or any of the Government's other grand Nation Building programs, Mr Ruddock encourages them to contact his Electorate Office with details.



## lan's C Hawkesbury S Fishing & Boating Report

Some hot weather of late has seen the Flathead and Bream become more active.

Baits of Hawkesbury prawns are proving to be the gun bait for the Duskies. Fish the drop offs where the Dusky will be waiting to pounce on any bait coming out of the shallow water. These areas would also work well casting soft plastic or hard bodied lures over the drop off. Good luck with your Dusky hunting!

Large rouge Bream to 44cm have been taking squid baits intended for Jewfish. Smaller but still good sized fish to 35cm can be found in the deeper water on the nip tides. On bigger tides you might find the Bream lurking near rocky shorelines, reefs, pylons, moorings or any structure in the water that has some type of growth on it. Bream love to eat: oysters, mussel, pippies, black crabs, squid, prawns, live nippers and more. Bream put up a big fight for their size, are great fun on light tackle and are fine table fish. In my opinion Bream are best cooked whole or cut in pieces either baked, BBQ'd or fried. Add some chips, salad or both, a wedge of lime or lemon maybe some salt and pepper. Mmmmm.

Meanwhile on Broken Bay the Tailor have gone quiet but the Bonito are thick. Troll your X-Rap around the headlands - Box, Lion and the Joey - for your share of bonito, bleed, ice slurry and fillet for excellent Thai fish cakes or bait for Bream and Snapper - cubed or cut in strips should land a good catch for you.

**Safety Tip:** Always if on the water at night display your navigation lights when under way or your all round white light if at anchor. It could save lives.

Line of the week: Hot Spot: Where a particular species of fish was yesterday.
