

and demand for sports facilities in the northern Sydney region has revealed a significant and growing shortfall in supply across LGAs in the region. The 81 page report prepared by

The 81 page report prepared by Otium Planning Group, assesses supply and demand in the region in line with forecasted population growth along with identifying both threats and opportunities to mitigating the shortfall.

Accounting for a projected 11.3% population increase in the NSROC area by 2036, the findings of this report help to inform both NSROC Councils and State and Federal Governments on the need for the continued rollout of such critical infrastructure in northern Sydneyinfrastructure that will support the recently released increased supply of housing via the State **Environmental Planning Policy** Amendment (Housing) 2023 that the northern Sydney region is preparing for: https://legislation.nsw. gov.au/view/pdf/asmade/epi-2023-

The launch of the event took place at the site of Hornsby Shire Council's **Westleigh Park** development—a future premiere sporting complex that will feature three sporting platforms encompassing six sports grounds including five fields and an athletic track. Commencing construction in late 2024, the facility, funded by Hornsby Shire Council and the NSW State Government, is the most significant single opportunity in the northern suburbs area to





- The need to increase the current supply capacity of NSROC sports facilities by 40% to 2026 (equivalent to 181Ha of total space) and 49% to 2036 (equivalent to 222Ha of total space)
- Identifying suitable land located in proximity to the majority of our population and high costs attributed to creating new sports facilities including sportsgrounds. NSROC President and Mosman Mayor Cr Carolyn Corrigan was joined by Hornsby Shire Mayor The Hon Philip Ruddock AO and President of Parks and Leisure Australia, Les Munn for the launch of the report. They collectively called on the State and Federal Governments to recognise the importance of on-going commitments to funding and grant programs for such facilities in the region.

Mosman Mayor Corrigan said, "Unfortunately, this latest report highlights that despite our best efforts, the mounting pressure of population growth is making it very tough for our member Councils to keep up with the demand." Hornsby Shire Mayor The Hon Philip Ruddock AO said, "The site of our Westleigh Development will become the largest single contributor of sports and recreational land in the NSROC region. In light of the findings of this report, that makes this facility simply crucial to the amenity of the northern Sydney region. And as the land is already acquired, it is a rare and significant opportunity to dissuade the impending shortfall that the modelling of the report indicates — one that we're proud to be delivering for our community and for neighbouring LGAs."

EVER WONDERED IF THOSE ROPE BRIDGES SAVE WILDLIFE FROM BECOMING ROAD KILL?

GOOD NEWS! An experiment by Ku-ring-gai Council staff to see if local possums could learn to use rope bridges to safely cross one of Ku-ring-gai's busiest roads appears to have been a success!

High above the bustling traffic on Ku-ring-gai's Lady Game Drive, possums are using purpose-built rope bridges to safely cross the road. Two rope bridges were installed earlier in the tree canopy above a section of Lady Game Drive. Now a joint team of Council staff and academics from the University of Sydney have begun monitoring the rope bridges which sit above the road.

Using eight remote cameras, all powered by solar panels, the team began investigating how many possums were using the rope bridges.

Much to the delight of the team, the cameras have detected both ringtail and brushtail possums regularly using the bridges, including mothers carrying their young.

Some possums have learnt to cross the road using the interior of the bridge, while others are using the top of the rope bridge.

Ku-ring-gai Mayor Sam Ngai said, "We all know that sense of grief when we see wildlife injured on the roads."

"It's encouraging to see these rope bridges have provided ringtails and brushtails with a safe way to move between feeding areas, and I look forward to the outcomes of the trial."

STATE GOVERNMENT HOUSING POLICY ON PUBLIC EXHIBITION

"If the proposed policy goes ahead, it could have a drastic effect on Ku-ring-gai" Mayor Sam Ngai



Ku ring gai Council believes that the proposed State Government Housing policy will mean far-reaching changes to new housing in Ku-ring-gai. Residents had only until 23 February to give feedback.

Under the government's proposed changes, dual occupancies will be allowed in most low-density residential zones in Ku-ring-gai on minimum block sizes of 450sqm, which effectively cover every suburb.

Terraces, townhouses, apartment blocks and shop top housing of up to seven storeys will be permitted near Ku-ring-gai's railway stations and local centres. In the case of apartment blocks and shop-top housing, developments with a 15% component of affordable housing will be allowed to have up to nine storeys in height.

The Ku-ring-gai Council area has been nominated by the state government for an additional policy called 'transport oriented development' (TOD). This would introduce a blanket six to seven storey height rule for unit developments near Killara, Roseville, Gordon and Lindfield railway

Other proposed changes to the government's planning rules would allow reduced landscaping and tree cover for new buildings developed under the proposed controls.

The public exhibition of the new housing policy made available on the government's website from 18 December. Public comments will be accepted until 23 February 2024.

"The government has chosen to advertise one of the most radical changes to housing policy during the summer holidays. Our residents deserve to understand the implications and have input into what is proposed," said Mayor Ngai.





EHYDRATION

To function correctly and remain healthy, our body requires the correct internal balance of water and electrolytes. At this time of year it is easy to become dehydrated when this balance is disturbed.



KU-RING-GAI COUNCIL DISPUTES MEDIA TREE CANOPY LEVELS

"We pride ourselves on having more trees than most council areas in Sydney and we are working hard to build further on our current canopy levels through the Urban Forest Strategy" Mayor Sam Ngai

Recent media reports have stated that Ku-ring-gai Local Government Area has lost 8.2% of its tree canopy between 2019 and 2022.

Ku-ring-gai Council disputes this finding by Western Sydney Leadership Dialogue and has since released the findings of its own study of the local tree canopy between March 2020 and March 2022.

Council commissioned *ArborCarbon* to assess Ku-ring-gai's tree canopy using their multispectral fixed wing camera in March 2020 and again in March 2022. These multispectral fixed wing data sets are comparable and conducted with the same methodology at the same time of year and under similar environmental conditions.

Western Sydney Leadership Dialogue, which compares with data from statewide assessment using satellite imagery in 2019 and again in 2022 uses multispectral fixed wing cameras.

According to Ku-ring-gai Council, these findings are incorrect as they compare two very different data sets.

The Council's data obtained between 2020 and 2022 states that Ku-ringgai lost a total of 1.4% of its tree canopy. *Tree canopy was defined in the assessment as vegetation more than 3 metres in height.*

Mayor Sam Ngai stated that while the media reports on tree canopy loss in Ku-ring-gai were incorrect, they highlighted a serious concern with the state government's proposed changes to housing policy.

"Council does have serious concerns about tree cover in the future as the state government's proposed changes to its housing policy would mean a serious reduction in greenery not just in Ku-ring-gai, but right across the state," said Mayor Ngai.

The Mayor said that Ku-ring-gai Council had adopted an Urban Forest Strategy in 2022 to boost its tree canopy and mitigate tree loss.

"This strategy aims to have a 49% canopy cover by 2036, which means an additional 44 thousand trees planted in Ku-ring-gai."

The Mayor added that residents should make their views known to the state government on its housing policy changes by 23 February. "If the government adopts their proposed changes in the current form, tree loss will be vastly accelerated in Ku-ring-gai and elsewhere," Mayor Ngai said.

WHAT TO EXPECT FROM A

DO YOU HAVE A HOME CARE ASSESSMENT COMING UP?

Seeking assistance to maintain your independence at home can be a bit overwhelming at times but rest assured - all assessors (called ACAT assessors) are qualified allied health professionals. They also undergo background checks. During the assessment, your assessor will engage in a conversation with you, discussing areas where you manage well and identifying areas where you might require support. This includes your interests, daily activities, appointments, and household tasks like shopping, cooking, and cleaning. They will inquire about vour social connections, considering friends, family, or any existing support network. Health-related discussions will also take place. focusing on how you maintain your wellbeing.

Assessors approach this information-gathering process through natural conversations. Collaborating with you and your carer, partner, or family member, the assessor will formulate a Support Plan. This plan outlines your preferences, concerns, goals, required support services, and any agreed-upon service referrals.



Typically lasting around an hour, the assessment may be extended if a caregiver is involved or if an interpreter is needed. Your assessor should transparently explain the assessment process, and the principles of privacy and confidentiality. You can access your recorded information through My Aged Care.

Afterward, you will receive a copy of the Support Plan, and a letter telling you what level of Home Care Package you have been approved for. You then contact a service provider of your choice, such as Your Side, to discuss service specifics, scheduling, and associated costs. This process is designed to facilitate your safety and confidence at home, tailored to individual needs and preferences. 

50 YEARS AGO

BEROWRA WOMEN'S HOCKFY TEAM BEGAN!

This year is 50 years since the Berowra Women's Hockey Club formed. They had a period of success and won a number of premierships and grew to three teams at one stage.

The Berowra Women's Hockey team was first established in 1974. A team was entered in the *North Shore Women's Hockey Association C Grade Saturday competition*, and they began playing even before the club was officially created.

After several rounds the club was formed on 8th July 1974 and a committee was set up. The club was made up of 16 women and some of their husbands. Fourteen women were from *Berowra*, one from *Mt Kuringgai* and one member was from *Thornleigh*. In later seasons several teams were formed that included many of members from outside Berowra, who joined via connections with Berowra members.

The team played in a tartan skirt, made by the ladies themselves, with white socks and a white polo shirt.

The president was **Mick Naylon** and Treasurer **Mick Spencer**. Players **Del Spencer** and **Bev McDermott** filled out the committee. Bev's husband, *a Scotsman*, was the first team coach.

There was also an important sub-committee of three players: goal-keeper Robin Gibbons, Sandra Hibbert and Lorraine Clark. They were responsible for social activities.

Other players in that first year were **Lorraine Dallinger** (who was a *Wideview Public School* teacher and goal scoring machine), **Pam Naylon**, **Judith McQuillan**, **Margaret Kennedy** (captain), **Julie Randall** and **Margaret Allen** (who was a talented player from Thornleigh).

Training was held at Berowra's only sports field at that time, Berowra Oval, initially on Wednesdays from 10am to 12pm.

In their inaugural season they were successful, winning more games than they lost. Their victorious results were recorded in the Advocate through their *Publicity Officer Dianne Stirton*. These showed big wins over *Dover* (11 to 1 & 10 to 0), *Manly* (8 to 0), *North Sydney* (6 to 1) and *Turramurra* (4 to 0). The team finished second in the C grade competition after losing the Final to Macquarie University.

Following on from the successful first season members went on a recruiting mission and there were enough players for two teams to be entered in 1975, a B grade and a C grade team.

There were some experienced and talented players to join in that second season including **Yvonne Maundrell**, **Anne Goddard** (Mt Colah resident & former Indian international player) and **Coral Johns**.

The lower graded team had several schoolgirls, including Asquith Girl High School student **Penny May** playing her first season of Hockey. The Club also secured a local field with some of their home games played on the Asquith Girls High School sports field.

To top off a great season in 1975, in August the B grade team upset the highly favoured Gordon team, 2 goals to 0, in the Final to become Premiers. The goal scorers in were Lorraine Dallinger (scored from a Sandra Hibbert cross) and Margaret Allen (scored directly from a corner). This was a sweet victory as Gordon had defeated Berowra 2 to 1 the previous Saturday, in the final week of competition and were hot favourites to win the Final.

Reportedly, that night there was a massive party held to celebrate the Berowra ladies' Premiership. Anne Goddard was voted "Best Player" for the victorious B grade team. School girl, Penny May was awarded Most Improved Player for the Club that season.

The girls wanted to continue their sporting enjoyment into the summer and decided to put together a women's cricket team, which was sponsored by the Berowra Cricket Club. However, this was short lived when they realised they had been put into a Sydney wide cricket competition and their first game was out at Botany. Many of the ladies simply could not make it out there and the team folded before it started. For their third hockey season, in 1976, fresh pre-season recruitment was again undertaken. The likes of Sue Lindsay, Leslie Christensen and Denise Newton joined the Club. It helped that Asquith Girls High School and Hornsby Girls High School were playing hockey for school sport. This meant many of the young ladies in the Berowra area, that joined the Club, had already played before.

To make it easier for players to attend training it was moved to Tuesday evenings 7.30pm to 9pm. The late time slot was chosen to work around other local sports teams using Berowra Oval including soccer and rupby league.

Berowra's A grade was to dominate and took out their premiership easily. The B grade team was also very strong but they were just beaten in their Final. In 1977 and 1978 Berowra Women's Hockey Club grew to the point



they could field competitive teams in Major A grade, A grade and B grade. Although they struggled for consistency in 1977 the following season the club often won all three grades in the same round. The Berowra Women's Hockey Club fielded teams for a number of additional seasons until many of the key women drifted away for different reasons and what was left of the Club transferred to Hornsby RSL which continues today.

Over the years members from the former Berowra Women Hockey Club have held several well attended reunions to rekindle memories of the Club and their impressive successes.






