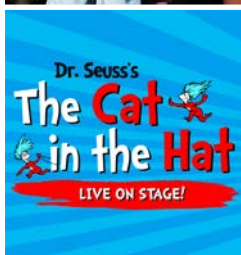

VACCINATE PET RABBITS NOW!

Rabbit owners in the Hornsby area are being urged to vaccinate domestic rabbits prior to the feral rabbit baiting program from 18 March 2020.

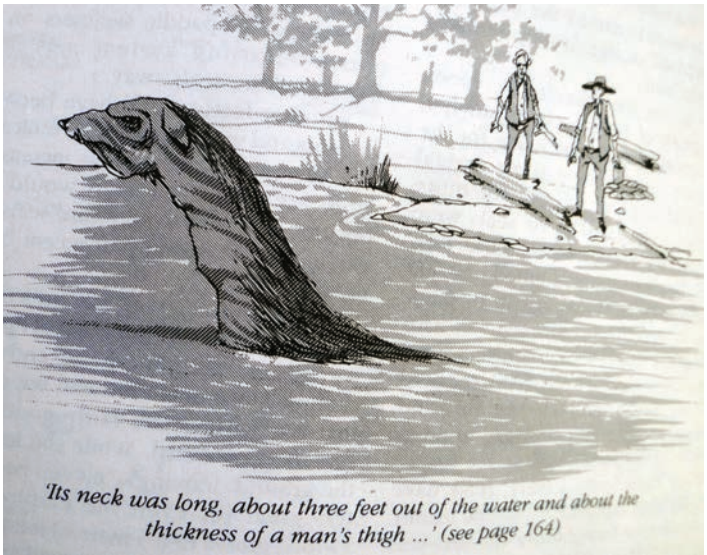
Led by Greater Sydney Local Land Services with the support of major landholders, local councils and environmental agencies, the program will see the release of the **Rabbit Haemorrhagic Disease Virus** known as RHDV1-K5.

The virus will be released throughout the Greater Sydney region including Galston and Dural in the Hornsby Shire.

Greater Sydney Biosecurity Officer **Jacob French** said, "This is the fourth release after the initial national program roll out in March 2017 which has led to a 47 per cent reduction in feral rabbit numbers across NSW."

Mr French said it was important domestic rabbit owners go to their local vets to vaccinate their pets prior to the release.

"The virus is spread mainly by contact between rabbits or via insects such as mosquitos and flies. Importantly, RHDV is only effective in rabbits and if pets are vaccinated they become immune," said Mr French.

**DO YOU HAVE A
HAWKESBURY 'MONSTER
STORY' TO SHARE?**

Tony Healy writes to the Editor: I'm hoping you'll consider running my story in *The Bush Tele* before I visit Brooklyn between 8 and 14 March, in search of 'the legendary creature' of The Hawkesbury.

Although the monster legend may be, as sceptics suggest, the result of a long series of misidentifications, tall stories and hoaxes, it just might be a genuine zoological phenomenon, worthy of serious attention. Certainly, some of the very early reports that I've read - from as far back as 1912 and 1924 are quite intriguing.

Since the early 1970s, researcher Tony Healy has roamed the world in search of semi-legendary creatures.

With his collaborator, **Paul Cropper**, Tony has written two books on Australian zoological mysteries: *Out of the Shadows* (Pan Macmillan, 1994) and *The Yowie* (Anomalist Books, 2006).

Having visited many other reputedly monster-haunted lakes and rivers, he is now focussing on The Hawkesbury, which has produced reports of large reptilian or eel-like animals since at least as far back as 1912.

While based at The Anglers Rest, Brooklyn between 8 and 14 March, Tony hopes to gather additional eye-witness testimony and to establish whether the mysterious creatures really do feature, as is sometimes suggested, in local Aboriginal lore.

BEROWRA RSL SUB-BRANCH SWIMMING CLUB TURNS 50!

In 2020 the Berowra RSL Sub-Branch Youth Club celebrates 50 years in the community.

The Club established most junior sports and activities in the local area in the 1960s and 70s. This included cricket, soccer, *Little Athletics*, netball, hockey, boxing, gymnastics and the **Berowra RSL Youth band**.

The Club was at its peak in 1970 with literally hundreds of local kids on their books across a variety of sports. That year the Berowra RSL Sub-Branch Swimming Club started and newly arrived Berowra resident, **John Wright**, was elected as the inaugural Swimming Club President. With his new committee John established the club, and in that first year thirty swimmers signed up.

Today membership is at 120 as the proud club celebrates its 50th Anniversary. Whilst most of the sports went on to become independent of the RSL Youth Club, the Swimming Club, along with the Youth Band, is still actively supported by the Berowra RSL Sub-Branch.

The Berowra RSL Swimming Club's celebrated their milestone on Sunday 23rd March 2020. *It was a nice touch that John Wright, who is still a Berowra resident, was on hand to help mark the occasion. John had plenty of tales to tell from those early years, when everything was done manually.*

There is still plenty of work that needs to be done today with the Club run entirely by parent volunteers, led by 2020 Club President, Martin Stephen.

The strong community culture within the Club was set in those early years and today they emphasize fun where members can learn a bit more of what swimming is all about, including racing in a fun and friendly competition. The swimmers enjoy themselves and are competing against kids with similar swimming abilities and times. The Club's vision is not to turn out potential Olympians but rather to give children the confidence in themselves as swimmers.

It is my pleasure to support the Club as an independent judge for their annual Jim and Roberta Hughes Award, to support a swimmer that demonstrates potential with their swimming, amongst other positive qualities. There are always some excellent nominations and this year was no exception with seven outstanding applications submitted. The winner will be announced at the Club's presentation later this year in May.



SETTING KIDS UP FOR LIFE



When the time came for **Maggie Noonan** (pictured, left) to leave primary school, her mother **Shanan Hall** was worried she would never gain the skills needed to live independently.

Maggie has a severe intellectual disability and has attended **St Lucy's School** in Wahroonga from Kindergarten.

"There aren't a lot of high schools for special needs kids and transitioning period between Year Six and Seven can be really daunting for kids who are very routine-focused," said Shanan.

When St Lucy's announced that the school was starting a new high school program, Shanan was relieved.

Principal of St Lucy's, **David Raphael**, said, *"The new high school will give students the chance to learn life skills to set them up for adulthood."*

"We have chosen the NSW Education Standards (NESA) Life Skills curriculum which has been deliberately written for students with a disability to access the mainstream curriculum which will be pertinent to their life skills."

David said that there was also a range of community participation programs to develop students' independence and hobbies, and VET courses planned for Years 9 to 12.

"The aim is that when students leave school many will be able to live independently, have a full or part-time job and navigate transport independently," he said.

St Lucy's (pictured right) has been a primary school since 1938. This year, there are Year Seven and Eight classes, with the school planning to go up to Year Twelve by 2024. The brand new \$12m two-storey school building has sixteen classrooms, with a kitchen in every classroom and adjoining

complementary learning spaces as well as an underground car park. It will open in Term 2.

TEACHING TO EACH CHILD

The new Principal at St Bernard's Catholic Primary School, Gill Austin, was drawn to the school because of the excellent "Deep Learning" framework it has been running for three years.

"It allows the teachers to go deeper into learning with children and have more meaningful experiences, so children can get to grips with complex topics from a range of angles," she said.

Ms Austin has also enrolled teachers at this co-ed primary school in Berowra in a workshop to learn how to cater to high-ability and 'gifted' students within the standard classroom.

Ms Austin said that children who were 'gifted' often became bored at school because they were so quick to learn.

"Usually with gifted children they only need to be shown something once and they've got it," she said.

"A good teacher's value is in their skill to engage students and encourage them to link and make connections in their learning and become problem solvers in the future."

Teachers will attend the two-day workshop at the University of New South Wales School of Gifted Education Learning and Teaching.

"It'll help us identify those students who are gifted and talented, and help us to differentiate the curriculum more fully for those gifted and high-ability students," she said.

"We'll be able to pose tasks which are more challenging and will extend [the children]."

Originally from the UK, Ms Austin has worked across the Broken Bay Diocese in Catholic schools including St Kevin's Catholic Primary School in Dee Why and Our Lady of Rosary Catholic Primary School at Waitara.
