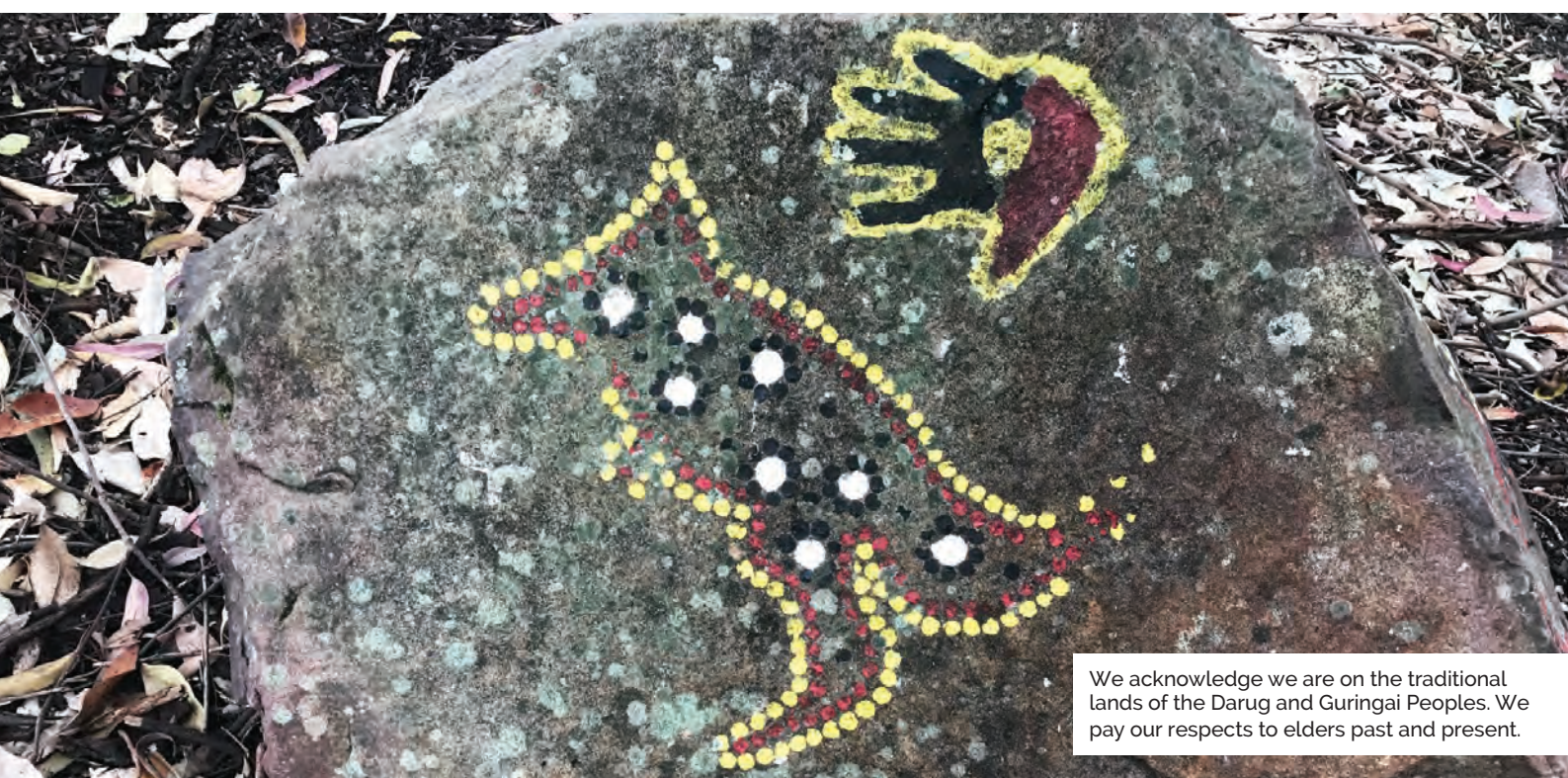

Wallerobba Arts and Cultural Centre

Wallerobba Art and Cultural Centre features local art, fostering the region's emerging talent. Hornsby Shire Council's heritage-listed arts hub hosts a range of various exhibitions throughout the year, displaying exciting new concepts and themes. Wallarobba homestead was built in 1903 and was transformed into the art centre by Hornsby Shire Council in 2012.

It also hosts various art classes with an art studio, multi-purpose printmaking room and an artist lounge.

Among the classes are free Friday printmaking sessions that are suitable for beginners and experienced printmakers, run by local artist John Crawford.

Wallerobba is located at 25 Edgeworth David Avenue, Hornsby. There is free parking behind Willow Park, but spaces are limited.

Waitara and Hornsby railway stations are within walking distances, while a bus stop is conveniently situated outside.



Ku-ring-gai Art Centre

Taught by industry professionals, Ku-ring-gai Art Centre offers visual art, creative writing and guitar classes for all levels of experience - from timid beginners to advanced students! Outstanding facilities include French hydraulic presses in the print room, pottery and sculpture studio with five kilns, well-equipped studios and an exhibition gallery. Held in light airy studios, the art centre provides a friendly and creative atmosphere for kids and adults.

The Art Centre holds regular events such as artists talks and exhibitions throughout the year.

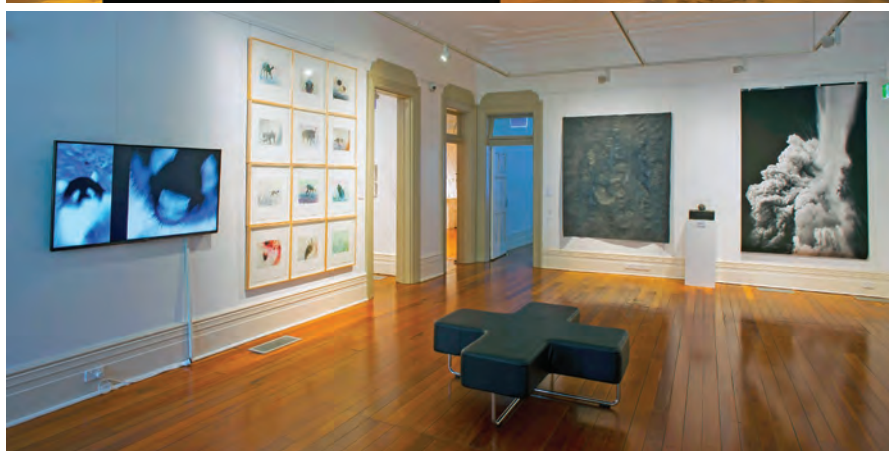

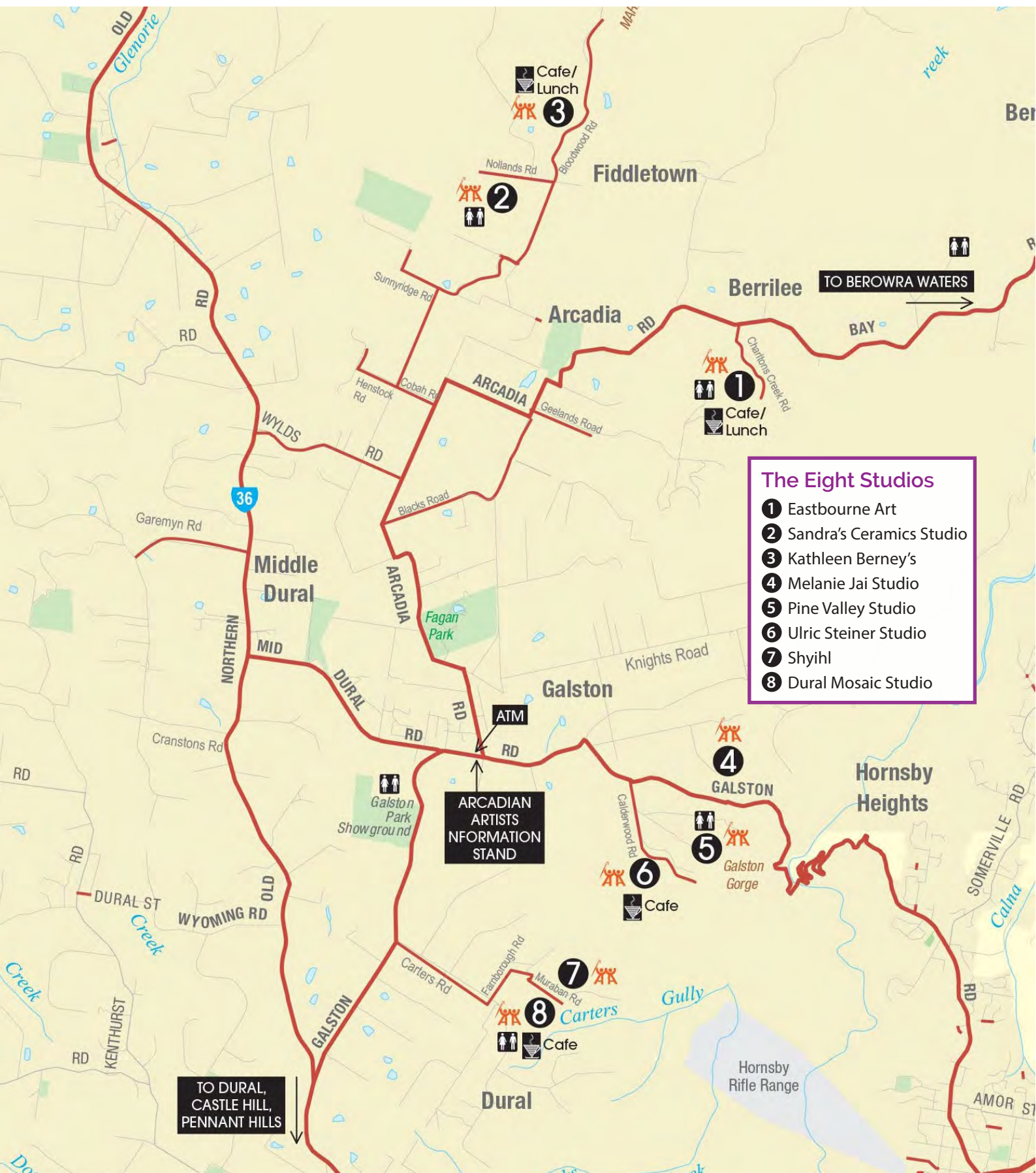

Australia's only metropolitan state forest, Cumberland State Forest, is a 40 hectare oasis of green set amongst Sydney's north-western suburbs, half an hour from the CBD at 95 Castle Hill Road, West Pennant Hills.

Enjoy one of Cumberland's revitalising native forest walks, meander through the tall eucalypt forest, explore drenched rainforest on the Palm Gully Trail, or touch, hear and smell your way along the Sensory Trail, which is stroller and wheelchair friendly.

Cumberland State Forest offers four leafy picnic and barbecue areas, where you are sure to find the perfect place for a family get together or social gathering, as well as an on-site cafe, native plant nursery and forest information centre.

Normal forest gate opening times are from 8.30am to 5.00pm, except during daylight saving times when they are open from 8.30am to 6.00pm.

Step out into Nature, and Back in Time

Almost 200 years ago the outskirts of Sydney was alive with the sounds of convict labour.

The Great North Road had been commissioned to provide a route from Sydney to the new farming lands in the upper Hunter Valley and work on the road was hard, with the conditions even harder. Convicts, some in leg irons, toiled away through the rugged bush to create the road that stretched some 240kms.



Come explore the length of the road by following the Convict Trail which traces the original road from start to finish, through the suburbs of Sydney and its rural outskirts across the Hawkesbury River at Wisemans Ferry & up into the Hunter Valley.

Built between 1826 and 1836 this road now serves as an open air museum. With its many bridges, stone walling, culvert drains and buttresses some as high as 10 metre, the road is a testament to the stonemasonry skills of those who laboured to build it.

The Great North Road remains today with much of the original road still in use.

Whether your passion is bushwalking, history, nature, photography or just getting out and experiencing new things, then this old road has something for you.

The World Heritage listed Devines Hill section at Wisemans Ferry takes around 1 and a half hours to walk and has a wealth of information about the road, its construction and history for visitors to read. Visitors can explore the length of the road by following the Convict Trail which traces the original road from start to finish, through the suburbs of Sydney and its rural outskirts, across the Hawkesbury River at Wisemans Ferry and up into the Hunter Valley.

Visit the past at Pioneer Village

The Australian Pioneer Village is a NSW listed open air Museum situated on 28 acres of beautiful picnic grounds on the Hawkesbury River at historic Wilberforce and located next to Rose Cottage built in 1811. The buildings were moved to the village to save them from demolition. Each building was moved structurally intact to preserve its historic integrity. The buildings were sourced from various locations and include:

Cartwright Cottage - Kurrajong, **St Matthews Church** - the Macdonald Valley, **Mangold Cottage** - Riverstone, **Aiken Hut** - Pennant Hills, **Kenso Cottage** - Kogarah, **Marsden Park School House** and **North Sackville Post Office** ... just to name a few.

Do a tour, go on an animal feed walk, refresh at the cafe, bring a picnic or BBQ. Book a birthday party or do a ghost tour!

Entry - \$5 adults, \$3 children, \$15 for 2 adults and 2 children. Rides are an extra cost.

ROUSE HILL HOUSE & FARM

Rouse Hill House & Farm have been owned by six generations of one family. With its grand stables and prize horses, orchards and elegant summerhouse, the house and its stories draw people to its door. Today Rouse Hill House & Farm also features the restored 1888 Rouse Hill schoolhouse, a section of the original Windsor Road turnpike proclaimed by Governor Macquarie in 1813 and the site of the doomed 1804 'Vinegar Hill' convict rebellion.

ROSE SEIDLER HOUSE

By the time Rose and Max Seidler moved into their new home in late 1950, it was the 'most talked about house in Sydney'. Designed by their son Harry, the house overturned almost every convention of suburban home design. It was in fact the promise of designing a house for his mother that brought Harry to Australia, and its success helped launch his Australian and soon after international career.

Hovering at the edge of the bush, with its stark, cube-like form Rose Seidler House sent shockwaves through the leafy tranquility of Sydney's upper north shore, then still more rural than suburban.

Today, still surrounded by bushland with panoramic views of Ku-ring-gai Chase National Park, the house is one of the finest examples of mid-20th century modern domestic architecture in Australia and its furniture and fittings form one of the most complete and intact post World War II design collections in public ownership. ELIZABETH FARM

This restful homestead hides a dark and stormy past. Built for the young military couple John and Elizabeth Macarthur and their growing family, Elizabeth Farm has witnessed major events in the growth of the colony. The house records the achievements, political intrigues and personal struggles of one of the early colony's most influential families.

In 1904 the house was purchased for £600 by local school teacher William Swann and his wife Elizabeth, whose efforts and affection for the house most likely saved it from destruction. In 1960 the house was listed as a historic site and in 1968 the property was transferred to the NSW government and opened as a public museum in 1984.

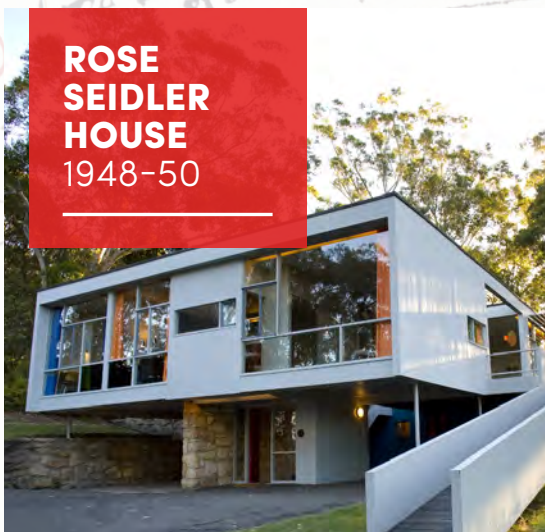

OXFAM TRAILWALKER

The 100km trail begins in the riverside township of Brooklyn on the Hawkesbury River. Starting with picturesque views at Parsley Bay, the trail quickly enters the bush and joins the Great North Walk. It then winds its way through the northernmost reaches of Ku-ring-gai Chase National Park and Berowra Valley National Park, presenting you with great physical challenges while your legs are still fresh. The 50km trail starts at Bobbin Head, and continues along the 100km trail for the majority of the walk.

The trail has many twists, turns, ascents and descents along the rugged bush tracks of the Mt Ku-ring-gai, Bobbin Head, Sphinx, and Warrimoo trails before reaching Garigal National Park. It then traverses the Harbour to Hawkesbury Walking Track (in reverse) as it follows Middle Harbour Creek.

The trail offers numerous stunning views, which become more spectacular as you leave Davidson Park and make your way to the Finish line. The last section follows the Spit to Manly walk, with stunning views high above Sydney Harbour, before the triumphant finish at Tania Park.

This is an incredible physical and mental challenge, where ordinary people commit themselves to fight against poverty and achieve the extraordinary.

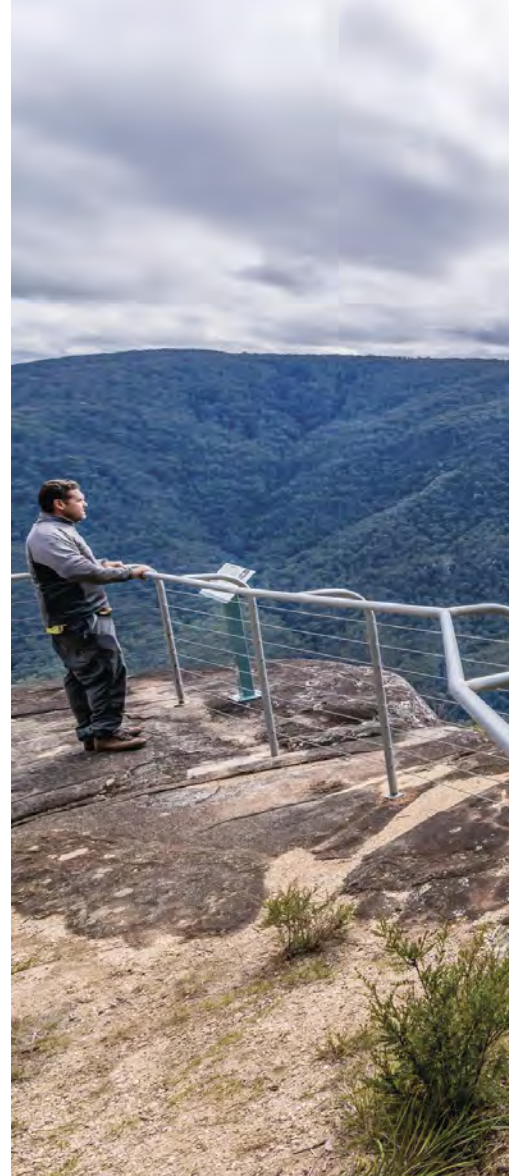
Campbell Drive via Twin Creeks to Mitchell Crescent, Wahroonga

4 km return, 3 hrs, Grade 3 track, steep

Browns Field borders two creek lines that encircle a grassed oval which lies in the flat valley floor of a small volcanic diatrema.

It is one of around 150 such diatremes scattered across the Sydney Basin. The track follows the creek line, winding through a beautiful rainforest community to a tall Eucalypt forest.

Along the ridge top, some rare species of Eucalyptus can be found, characteristic of the dry Sydney sandstone and complimented further down by the moist terrain covered with Blackbutts.



Sphinx, Warrimoo & Bobbin Head tracks

9.6 km Circuit, 4 hrs, Grade 3 Moderate track

This walk is one of the best ways to discover some of the history and beauty in **Ku-ring-gai Chase National Park**. For most of the walk you will feel a million miles away from everything, but with the added benefit of a toilet and café break halfway! *The walk loops back up to the same place you started, making it easy whether you come by car or bus.*

Start the walk from the carpark at the carved '**Sphinx Memorial**', where it is worth spending some time enjoying the skill and story behind this impressive stonework. From here you follow a track and signs as you head down through a gully to the edge of the stunning **Cowan Creek**.

Once down near the river you turn left and meander alongside the river among the ferns, mixed forest, sandstone caves and aboriginal middens.

Back track a short distance then climb up along a steep track, with more stunning views over the river. Then you get to follow the original Bobbin Head access road, long since closed to traffic, as it winds back up the hill. It is a bit of climb, but if you use the views as an excuse to rest you will enjoy it more. Part way back along this old road, keep your eye out for the aboriginal engravings on a rock platform. This walk starts from the car park at the end of Sphinx Rd (off Bobbin Head Rd) North Turramurra.

Entry fee for vehicles (\$12) but if you walk in (about 700m) from the bus stop (buses 577 & 594) outside Lady Davidson Hospital there is no entry fee. The Sphinx carpark is locked at 5.30pm. For free detailed track notes and maps visit

Hornsby Mountain Bike Trail

There is six kilometres of white-knuckle riding through the picturesque Old Mans Valley, located just minutes from Hornsby Train Station. The trail is accessed from Quarry Road, Hornsby, where car parking is available.

What are the trail features?

The single-track mountain bike trail is a combination of narrow bushland trails and flowing one-metre-wide trails. *Whether you're looking for a technical ride or simply want to release the brakes along the flow trail, you're bound to find it.*

What about beginners?

There is a *green trail* for the less experienced riders, however this will not be as easy to ride as the previous green trail and caution should be taken.

This green trail is suitable for competent bike riders with some off-road experience.

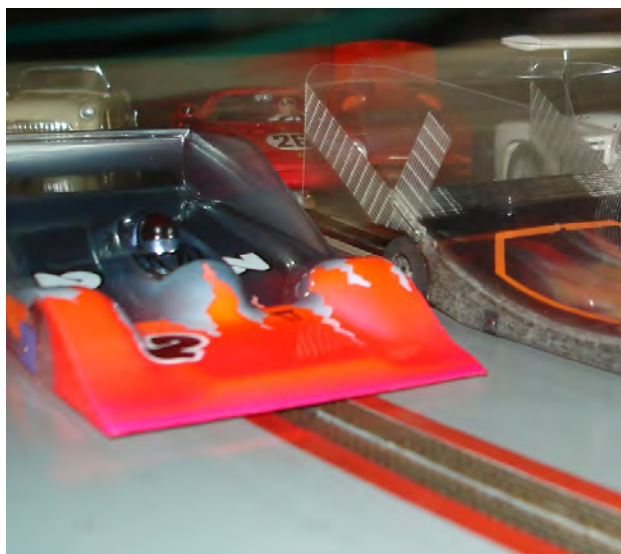

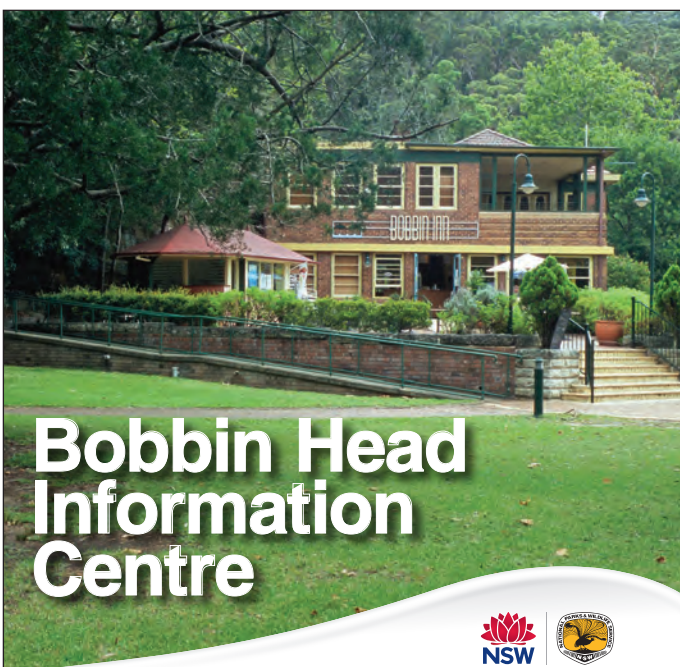

Marine Rescue Hawkesbury LOG ON AND LOG OFF

Boaters should Log On and Log Off with their nearest Marine Rescue unit whenever they head out on the water.

This is a simple process that lets Marine Rescue know when you're leaving, where you're heading and when you expect to return. This way, someone responsible knows that you're out on your boat and that you've returned safely at the end of your trip.

These are the details we'll need to help find you in the event of an emergency:

- Your vessel name
- Vessel registration number
- Communications gear on board (VHF, 27MHz, MF/HF)
- Mobile telephone number
- Vessel type and length
- Hull and topsides colour
- Where the vessel is usually kept/launched
- Shore contact name
- Shore contact number
- Time and place of departure
- Log on location
- Number of people of board
- Destination & purpose of trip
- Expected time of return

When to Log On:

Marine Rescue NSW urges boaters to log on every time they go out in their boats. If you're simply out for a day, you'll know you've told someone responsible when you're due to return and we will check and take the appropriate action if you haven't called in by then. If you change your planned time of return, call the radio base again and advise us of your change in plans.

When to Log Off:

Log Off by using your marine radio to tell us when you return. If we don't know you're back safely, we'll take action to find you.

The new MarineRescue App is making it easier than ever for boaters to Log On, Log Off and stay safe on NSW waters. It's the only app that will connect you directly to Marine Rescue NSW. You can download the free app at the App Store for Apple devices or Google Play for Android.

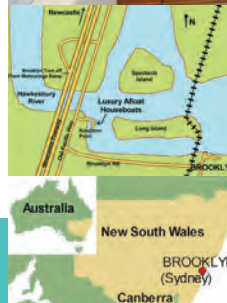

The Hawkesbury River is well known for its fishing, thanks to the mighty Jewfish which is a highly sought after catch for any local fisherman. Jewfish can grow in excess of 60kg. We fish the lower Hawkesbury where as well as the Jewfish other fish can also be targeted such as **Kingfish, Australian Salmon, Bream, Flathead, Luderick, Hairtail, crabs & squid.**

The mouth of the Hawkesbury River opens up into Broken Bay which harbours Lion Island & offers great reef fishing for Bream & ocean pelagic fish such as schools of Salmon, Tailor & Bonito or Frigate Mackerel. *It's great fun spotting a school of fish bubbling on the surface & hooking up to them on a light fishing rod.*

Pittwater also adjoins the eastern mouth of the Hawkesbury River which harbours schools of Kingfish & big squid. **Kingfish are another well-known sporting fish.** They put up a great fight due to their size & sheer strength plus they are a quality eating fish, just like the Jewfish.

Brisbane Waters is connected to the Hawkesbury River via Broken Bay & is a large estuary with active oyster leases which attract big bream & whiting & nice sand banks perfect for catching huge flathead.

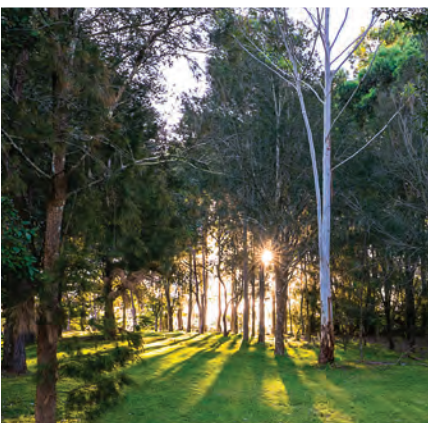

The Berowra Water Ferry crosses the beautiful Berowra Creek at Berowra Waters from Bay Road to Berowra Waters Road. This ferry is capable of carrying 15 cars with a safe load limit of 90 tonnes.

Note: trucks longer than seven metres are not able to approach the ferry due to road restrictions.

Operating time: 24 hours, seven days a week, EXCEPT on its Service Day: Ferry services will not operate on the second Tuesday of each month between 12 noon and 2.30pm. **Trip duration:** three minutes (please allow up to *at least* 10 minutes waiting time).

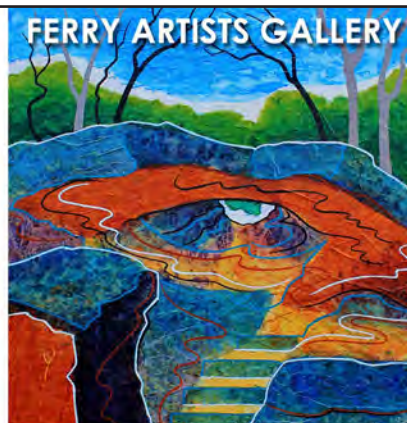


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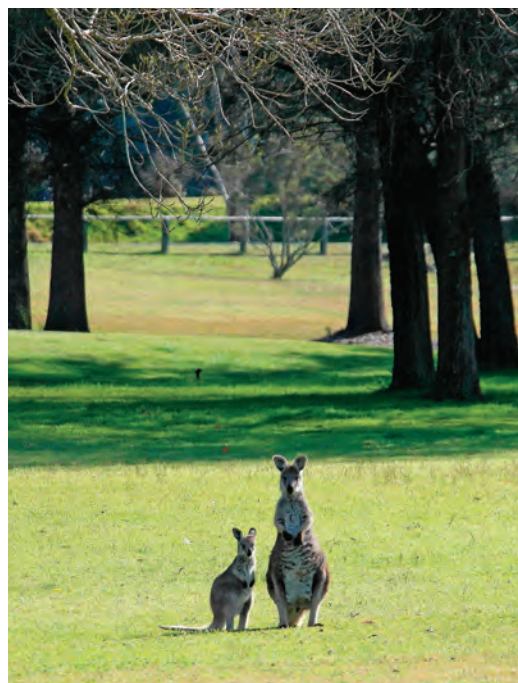


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Wisemans Ferry ...

... some history

It was Governor Arthur Phillip who began searching this land in 1789 and found the river which he named The Hawkesbury River.

Exploration of the area was to find fertile soil to grow crops to support the colony. The Governor decided against a settlement here due to flooding, but by 1794 a land grant was given near the present town of Windsor and within two years, 400 Europeans were living on the banks of the Hawkesbury.

In 1817 **Solomon Wiseman** was granted a lease of 200 acres from **Governor Macquarie** on the Hawkesbury River at Lower Portland Head. When he heard that the Government intended to build The Great North Road between Sydney and the Hunter Valley, he persuaded the authorities to route it through his land. The road-building commenced in 1826 with two convict gangs operating either side of the river.

In 1827 through connections with **Governor Ralph Darling**, Solomon received a contract to supply all provisions to the gangs and later that year, a licence to operate a ferry and to transport people, foods, goods and stock across the river. It was not unusual in those days to ask the passengers of the ferry for their help in pulling themselves across the river, until motors were installed in 1927. People did have to pay a toll to use this ferry service. The Government took over operation of the ferry years later and the toll was abolished.

In 1826 Solomon built on his land an elaborate house for his second wife Sophia called 'Cobham Hall', which is now known as Wisemans Inn Hotel.

The ferry crossing at Wisemans Ferry is the oldest in Australia, having operated continuously since 1827, for 24 hours a day and is about the last thing in New South Wales that is free!

After the death of Solomon Wiseman, people in the town found that Wiseman had so dominated the everyday life of the area that the name of the place was changed from Lower Portland Head to Wisemans Ferry.

Wisemans Ferry is also known for the Singleton's Mill, approximately 10 km down Singleton Road. It was one of the first flour mills in the country that was turned by the power of the tide, and was constructed before 1818 by brothers **Benjamin and James Singleton**.

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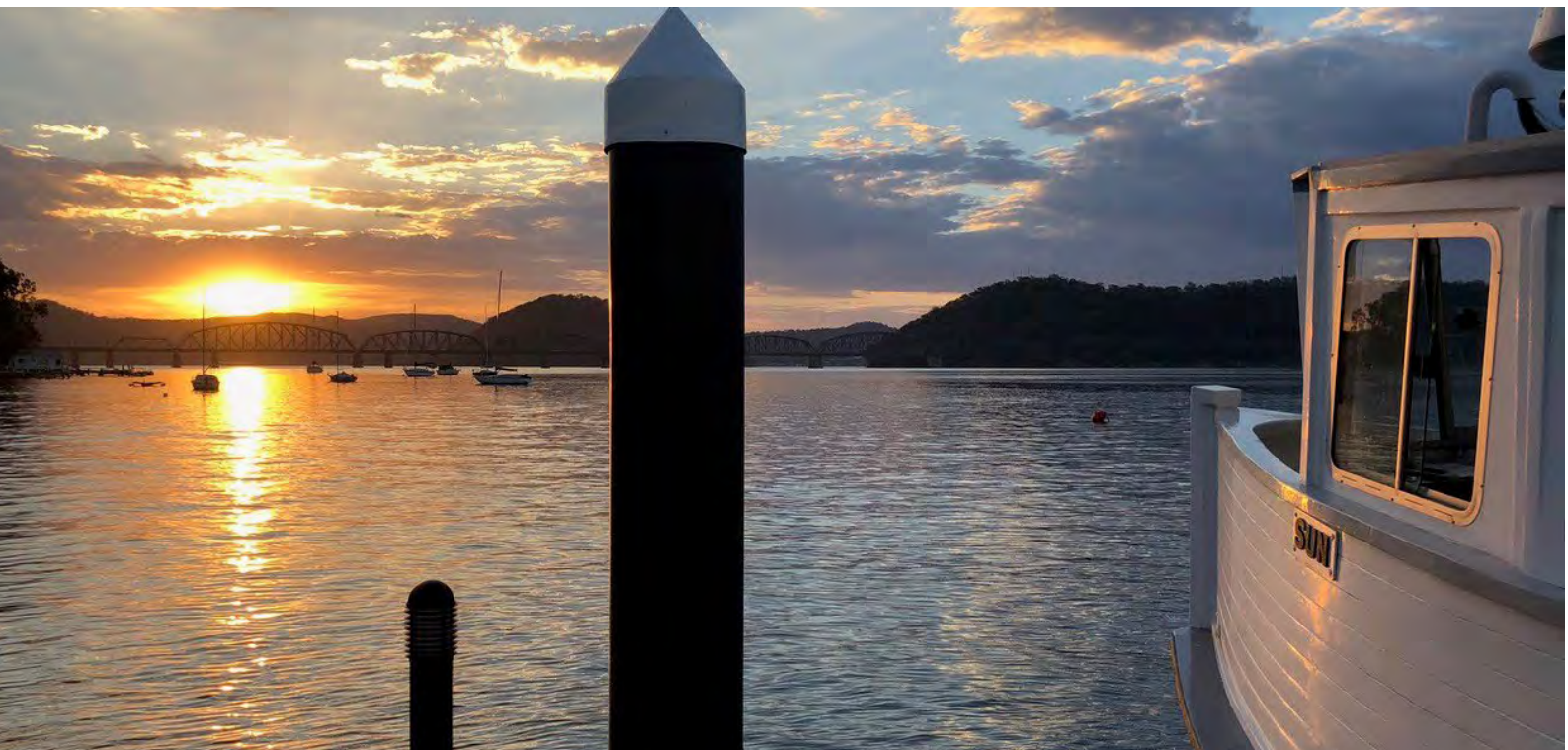

The small riverside village of Brooklyn (pop. 722) is known as the gateway to the Hawkesbury River. It is just 47km north of Sydney and easily accessible along the M1 freeway. Brooklyn can also be reached by rail (Hawkesbury River Rail Station.)

If you love seafood, Brooklyn is the place to tempt your appetite with riverside eateries within an easy walk from the station. Visit the Marina, the historic Angler's Rest Hotel and sit in the sun while you gaze across the river and wave as the trains trundle past.

Brooklyn's **McKell Park** is an ideal spot to enjoy some of the freshest fish and chips and it has some of the best views in Australia.

Fishers and boaties are plentifully catered for at Parsley Bay with its newly extended boat ramp and ample car park. If you want to hire a boat – from a kayak to a houseboat – there are many friendly local businesses that can assist you make the right choice to ensure your best holiday ever! A trip here is not complete without a ride on Australia's only River Boat Postman!

Dangar Island has amazing views of the Hawkesbury River. Come and explore the parks, beaches and natural bushland that are on offer. Discover the 100 animal species that share the island, as well as the 90 species of plants.

The only known location of the endangered Blackbutt rough-barked apple forest is on Dangar Island. Dangar Island is rich in indigenous, colonial and natural history. The island has a population of around 300 people and is one of the few suburbs of Sydney without cars. Golf carts are used to travel around the island, while wheelbarrows are used to move things.

Kangaroo Point

One of our most popular spots to take best advantage of Hawkesbury River views is Kangaroo Point recreation area & boat ramp.

The Point is easy to access and is located just off the Old Pacific Highway.

There are also sandstone seating walls, picnic tables, a drinking fountain and bike racks, so that visitors can take their time and really enjoy the broad estuary vistas.



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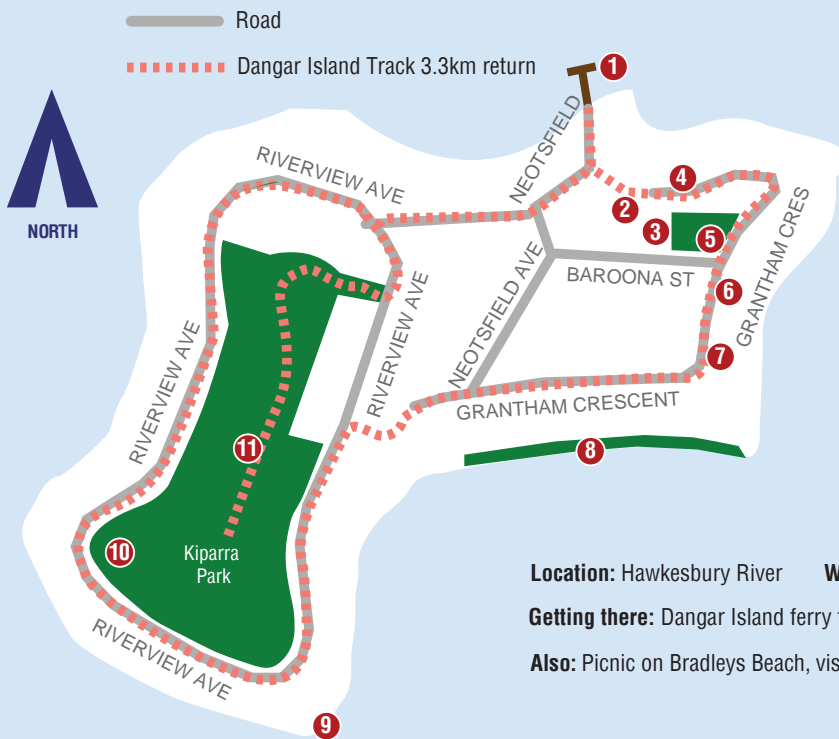
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A guided walk around Dangar Island



Dangar Island was known as a gathering place for members of the Guringai language group and evidence remains of their history in engravings, middens and rock shelters on the island. European history dates from 7th March 1788 when Governor Phillip and his party camped on the island for the night. A large quantity of mullet was caught and they named the island "Mullet Island".

From 1886 – 1889 Dangar Island was leased to the Union Bridge Company during the construction of the railway bridge over the Hawkesbury River.

During WWII Dangar Island was a base for Army and Navy personnel protecting the railway bridge from potential Japanese submarine attacks.

Location: Hawkesbury River **Walk length:** 3.3 km return **Facilities:** Picnic areas, toilets

Getting there: Dangar Island ferry from Brooklyn, water taxi, private boat

Also: Picnic on Bradleys Beach, visit the general store for refreshments

- 1 Public wharf
- 2 Dangar Island historic water tower
- 3 Community hall park and toilets
- 4 Remains of Henry Carey Dangar's 1890 home
- 5 Dangar Island Bowling Club
- 6 Blackbutt trees located on Grantham Crescent are heritage listed.
- 7 Plaque commemorating Captain Phillip's landing
- 8 Bradleys Beach
At Bradleys Beach you can see the remains of a shellfish midden, which is evidence of Aboriginal occupation of the island. Middens are composed of the discarded shells of a variety of molluscs such as oysters, cockles and pippies, which were consumed by the Aboriginal people.
- 9 At this location, WWII boom nets were anchored to prevent entry of Japanese submarines.
- 10 The rock shelves and midden at this site are testament to previous Aboriginal presence on the island.
- 11 Kiparra Park
The vegetation community at Kiparra Park is Blackbutt – Rough Barked Apple Forest and is regarded as being of regional conservation significance. View Aboriginal engravings of a wallaby and fish and also axe grinding grooves.

Getting there

Dangar Island is the perfect destination for a day trip and a great way to keep the kids happy in the holidays.

It is always exciting, for kids and grown-ups alike, catching the beautifully restored historic Brooklyn Ferry to Dangar Island. The Ferry departs from Brooklyn Wharf, located next to Hawkesbury River Rail Station, at regular intervals and is a picturesque 20 minute ride across the river to Dangar Island. The Dangar Island Wharf has just been upgraded.

Once on the island there is lots to do, from dropping in to the Dangar Island Depot or Bowling Club to keep refreshed, exploring the Island (two to three hours) and discovering evidence of Indigenous occupation in Kiparra Park, swimming at Bradley's Beach, picnicking or joining in one of the many Island events such as Australia Day and New Year's Eve celebrations. There is also a children's playground to keep the kidds amused.

Bird Watching At The Garden

Native birds are everywhere in the Ku-ring-gai Wildflower Garden!

Visitors will see curious brush turkeys or hear the raucous laughter of kookaburras. There are also rarer birds such as the scarlet honeyeater and the glossy black-cockatoo.

Here are some tips to get the best out of your birdwatching experience:

- Early morning is often the best time of day to see and hear native birds. Gates open at 8am.
- Rainy weather is a good opportunity to encounter lyrebirds.
- Powerful owls may be spotted roosting in the tall trees in the valleys along Ku-ring-gai Creek and Tree Fern Gully.
- When the she-oaks are fruiting along the lower Solander Trail, glossy black-cockatoos often visit in small groups.

St Ives Showground

St Ives Showground is Ku-ring-gai's largest sports and recreation venue with equestrian and dog training rings, soccer field, BMX riding facilities, BBQs and picnic tables. It plays host to numerous events throughout the year, from community markets to dressage competitions, and is also the venue for the annual St Ives Show.

St Ives Showground is situated on the edge of natural bushland, providing a refuge for wildlife, and forms part of the Duffys Forest endangered ecological community.

Camping is not allowed at the showground. *Try Lane Cove River Tourist Park or search the National Parks website for campgrounds.*

HISTORY The site has been used as a showground since 1927, when the St Ives Show Society held their fifth annual show at what was then the Northern Suburbs Showground. It was used solely for the annual show and horse events until 1941 when the 18th Battalion, known as the Ku-ring-gai Regiment, occupied the site for the duration of World War II. The Showground today is marked by a few army buildings and a considerable number of concrete platforms and brick buttresses where wash houses, mess huts and the battalion headquarters once stood.

Roseville Cinema

One of the few surviving independent cinemas in Sydney's suburbs, Roseville Cinemas has long been a fixture of the North Shore community. The building was originally erected in the early 1900's by Ku-ring-gai Council to serve as the Town Hall for the area. When World War I broke out, the first Australian recruitment drive for soldiers was held in the building.

In 1919 after the war, it was renamed *Traynor's Picture Palace*. In 1936 a pioneer of Australian film production, **DB O'Connor**, renovated the cinema in the beautiful *Art Deco* style with a seating capacity of over 500 people.

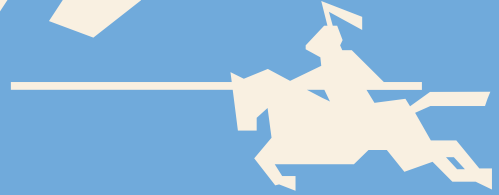
A family owned business, in 1995 it was converted to a twin cinema, and in 2011 underwent a massive overhaul, replacing both ageing film projectors with state-of-the-art digital technology.

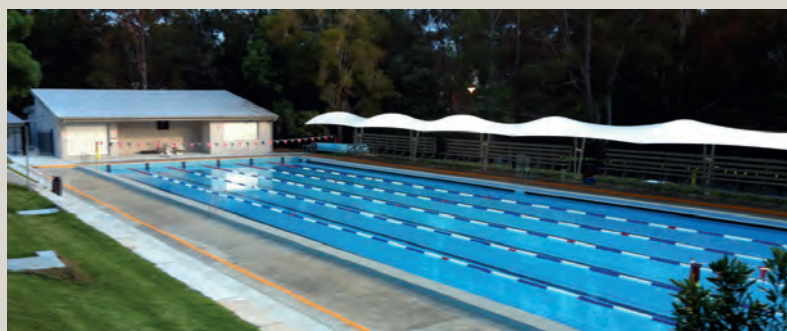

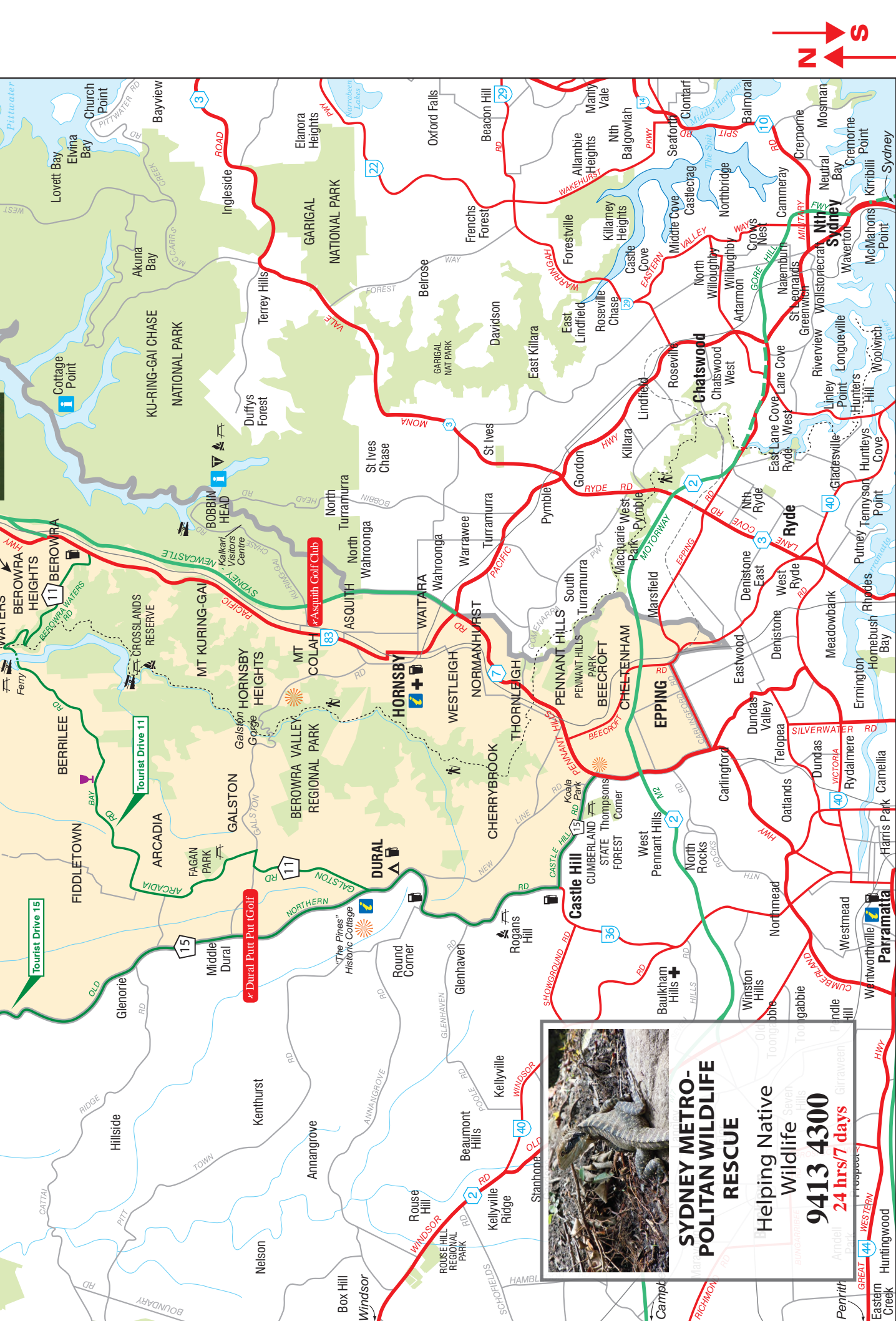
